

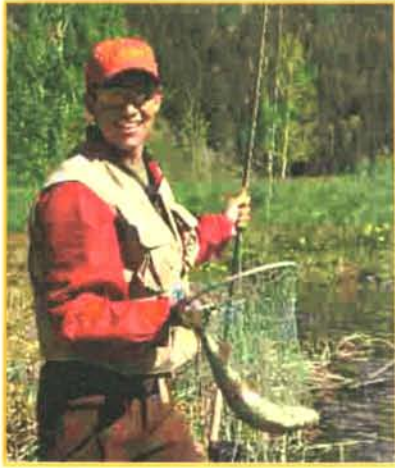
Wanted: 20 Happy Campers

The Colorado Trout Unlimited River Conservation and Fly Fishing Youth Camp is a weeklong experience that introduces students aged 14-18 to the principles of science-based conservation and the fine arts of fly fishing and fly tying.

Participants learn from experts in various fields of environmental science, representing organizations such as the U.S. Forest Service, Colorado Division of Wildlife, the Environmental Protection Agency and Colorado State University.



Activities include participating in a habitat restoration project, snorkeling to observe fish behavior, water quality sampling, tours of a hydro-electric facility and

Academic sessions include stream ecology, entomology, hydrology and human impacts on Rocky Mountain eco-systems.

Cost for the 6-day camp is \$450, but financial aid is often available from TU chapters. To find your local chapter, visit www.cotrout.org or phone Colorado Trout Unlimited at 303-440-2937.

Applicants must be 14-18 years of age and must submit an application (available at www.cotrout.org) as well as a brief essay on why the student would like to attend the camp.

Successful candidates will be selected by CTU staff and chapter leaders based on the student's commitment to learning about conservation.
